

### DWA provides:


- water management

## **Current local conditions**

The Coachella Valley area is in a good position when it comes to water.

- Aquifer = buffer from drought
- Still must follow regulations
- Conservation is needed for the long run





The Governor and State Water Board are asking Californians to save. Experts are predicting another La Niña (possibly dry) year.

The Colorado River is facing extreme drought conditions.





- We use more water than we get naturally
- Rights to water from Sierras (State Water Project)
- Exchange agreement with Metropolitan Water
- Get deliveries from the Colorado River
- Water soaks into ground to replenish aquifer







Shortage Level 1(always in effect)

- Restriction on overspray and runoff from sprinklers
- No watering after rain
- Limited water use for hard surfaces
- Water fountains must use recirculated water



# Current water restrictions

Shortage Level 2 (in place as of June 2022 due to regulation)

- Sprinklers prohibited during daylight hours
- Discourage overseeding

### Additional from State:

 Restrictions around "non-functional turf" for HOAs and businesses





Water Waste

⊘ Patrol ⊘

All DWA personnel can cite water waste.

- 85 employees, 5 board members
- 40 vehicles marked with Water Waste Patrol

### **PENALTIES**

First offense: \$50 for single-family, \$100 for all other

Second offense: \$100 for single-family, \$200 for all other

Third offense (and beyond):\$250 for single-family, \$500 for all other

DWA may turn water off to customers not making efforts to comply.

# What DWA is doing

- More citations/enforcement staff time
- More outreach/advertising to inform people
  - Bill inserts, billboards, videos, eblasts, etc.
- More resources/staff on conservation programs
- \$2M budget augmentation for grass removal (\$3.6M budget total for this fiscal year)

## What we're doing - outreach

















- Grass removal: at \$3 per square foot; special funds available for low-income
- Additional \$3 per square foot match from the City for applications after Dec. 1 (\$5,000 max per property while funds lasts)
- Sprinkler nozzles: up to \$5 per nozzle & \$2 each for install
- Irrigation controller: residential up to \$150 for device & \$100 for install; commercial up to \$10,000 for device & \$750 for install
- EnergyStar washing machines: \$250 for residents


