PURPOSE

OBJECTIVES

Encourage neighborhood identity

- Explore participation in MW Fall 2026
- Establish Modernism Week Committee and plan/Implement a February 2027 Home Tour
- Plan/implement Twin Palms 70th Anniversary activities and events
- Support complementary guided walking tours for residents
- Implement a plan for replacing/upgrading three existing neighborhood entry signs and/or new signs
- Maintain the Little Free Library
- Maintain the upgraded Twin Palms Krisel Exhibit and explore display venues.

Build a sense of community within the neighborhood

- Actively promote and encourage membership in the TPNO
- Produce “welcome” packet and launch an outreach plan
- Hold 3 membership meetings—October, January (social) and April
- Operate Community Grants and Neighborhood Initiatives Programs and make grants
- Expand efforts to enhance/highlight the role and visibility of all Board members
- Strengthen relationships with HOAs and businesses within the neighborhood

Follow organization by-laws and best business practices

- Develop/Monitor 2026 and 2027 Budgets, and provide financial reports
- Finalize and implement corporate/tax exemption status
- Develop a membership data-base
- Monitor/enhance/promote communications plan including applicable social media outlets
- Scale and leverage Board communications technology solutions
- Maintain an effective and efficient leadership structure per by-laws
 - Elect officers
 - Hold a minimum of 6 Advisory Board meetings
 - Recruit new board members as needed
 - Establish Ad Hoc Task Groups and standing committees as needed

Facilitate interaction with the City of Palm Springs

- Foster relationships with city officials, police, and fire, and invite to attend TPNO events as appropriate
- Ongoing participation in ONE PS
- Pursue options to improve traffic control within the neighborhood
- Monitor potential neighborhood developments and provide/facilitate input as appropriate.
